## **Borrodale School Project**

- Following design meeting at HRI on 27 October 2015, QS (Torrance) updated the future budget costing to £1.498m as of 30 October 2015, excluding professional fees, VAT, fixture & fittings.

The above figure includes the additional £60k roads costs for road widening, drainage, replacement of front wall.

Savings of £42k were made by: Biomass: switching the bespoke housing to a pre-packaged unit - Surfacing: Hard permeable surface from entrance to a point 4 bays up; remainder is plastic grid, with membrane and chips finish.

Cattle grids: Two agricultural grids added to both entrances and included within the above costs.

Pick Everard (M&E) have been in contact with Scottish Hydro provide a clearer estimate of the electricity supply costs, to date options we have:

£6K for 'Split Phase' supply, QS has allocated £40k for a 3 phase supply within the £1.498m budget. Updated estimate from SSE for 3 phase 68kva supply as of 5 November 2015 is £18.5k (+ VAT), plus groundworks, hence the latest budget figures more than cover this amount.

Jean Hamilton has updated full project financials and business plan, these have been reviewed by Borrodale Sub-Group as part of the draft submission to funders and are available for review.

Funding- Jean, Elgar & Jason worked together following the

funding conference call on 8 October 2015 to produce all the documentation and updates required.

Actions / Outcomes on previous points:

- 1. Financials financial summary included in the draft submission provided absolute clarity about who is funding what part of the project
- 2. Borrodale Sub-Group first meeting took place 29 October 2015, next meeting date to be scheduled at tonight's Board meeting.
- 3. Project bank account Joy to provide an update
- 4. Draft GCA Stage 2 application target mid Nov submitted 9 Nov

Jean Hamilton continues to liaising with Resource Efficient Scotland and Scottish Hydro Community Trust and others regarding loans / funding for electrical connection and the Biomass system.

Architect / Progress

Structural Engineers (Aecom): have responded to a request from Elgar / Trust to finalise the roads agreement with Highland Council by 26 November 2015

Structural Engineers (new): HRI liaising with two new structural engineering companies due to Aecom's lack of appetite for the project and inflated professional fees.
