The Development Officer:  Elgar will set up a working group made up of stakeholders for Meanish Pier Project.  Main priorities are making safe and improving the slip, parking, toilets and showers, notice board, seating, units for business if it is feasible, the project could earn the community £20,000 per year. <b>Joy's visit to Rum:</b> Saw some of their community projects including the toilets which are free and showers with an honesty box.	
Elgar will create a document to define terms of reference for the pier subgroup. Gordon will draft this and a lawyer will check it over. The lease we have from the crown estate will need to be signed off by the lawyers.	
<b>Housing Project</b> : Progressing well, a brief report of the housing needs survey which went to every resident of the area returned poor results. It would seem there is a need for 1 bedroom affordable housing. The survey will be finished next week and a feasibility study will also be finished next week. We have a price offer for a piece of land from Richard.	
<b>Church and School:</b> HIE have offered £8,500 grant for a feasibility study on the church and school. Elgar has put out to tender. Then there will be a process of selecting	

consultants for this. £150,000 has been asked for the school and teacher's house and	
land. The GT will get a separate evaluation.	
Donald MacKenzie will get back to us about the Church's position on the building. GT	
has a funding offer for a feasibility for the Church, this has a cut-off date for tendering	
28 <sup>th</sup> Feb 2014.	Donald

The Broadband Project: is now finished. It was held by Jane Beaton from citizens on-	Campbell

see if we can have an advanced paid for course in Glendale.	
<b>Transport:</b> This would employ another local development officer to work on transport	Elly
needs for Glendale, Struan and Waternish. A private bus service is needed especially	
in the summer when the school bus is of, for local businesses for staff. Put up an	
advert in the shop for project LDO for Glendale. There are enough funds for another	
worker.	
LDO Post funding: HIE is doing an internal review of the whole system to see how they	
are going to continue. There is a salary fo £7,800 left, overheads for a computer and	
projector £2,500, travel and subsistence of £3000.	
It was suggested that we take a trip to look at Knoydarts affordable housing project	
and Rhum's bunkhouse project. Elgar will organise this.	
The Meanish Pier, Housing and School and Church all have project manager roles.	Elgar
